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LGBT Health Panel

Panelists: Ann Burke, Fenway Health; Sasha Heggie-Jackson, Health Imperatives; Les Taylor, Parents and Friends of Lesbian and Gay Youth (PFLAG)

Sasha:

- Works for A New Day program at Health Imperatives- short term crisis center for survivors of sexual assault.
- Offer support group and medical advocacy. Work with hospitals whenever rape/assault reported.
- Health Imperatives has a sexual and reproductive health clinic and works with BrAGLY (Brockton Alliance of GLBT Youth). Also offer a teen parents program and a medical advocacy program to help individuals experiencing trauma at the doctor/hospital.
- Mindfulness and sensitivity are very important.
- Health Imperatives covers southeastern MA as well as the Cape and Islands.

Les:

- Represents local PFLAG (made up of LGBTQ individuals, family members and allies) and SHAGLY support groups. Got involved with PFLAG as an ally in California. Volunteers with PFLAG Chapter in Duxbury at First Parish Church.
- PFLAG is for all ages- welcome allies and individuals struggling with journey. In past four years, have seen 90% transgender issues. The group is friendly and meets for 2 hrs. once a month from 7-9pm on the 4th Monday. Have a speaker each month with an hour for discussion. Every other month they show a movie/documentary.
- Run SHAGLY program concurrently- at same time and place for folks ages 13-22. Revived this group about 2 years ago. The meeting is a nice, off-site and comfortable space outside of school for kids to talk.
- Les put together a list of area providers that counsel trans youth in particular to share.

Ann:

- Fenway Health started in the 1970s and its mission is to make life healthier for the people in our neighborhood, the LGBT community, people living with HIV/AIDS and the broader population. Offer healthcare, education and resources for the LGBT community.
- Have also seen transgender issues come to the forefront lately- offer a transgender health program. Shared info on a great resource- a card to hand to provider with preferred pronouns. All physicians at Fenway are transgender friendly and trained in transgender care.
- Services include: HIV Counseling, testing, referrals, primary care, eye, dental, behavioral health services, women's health, and more.

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- Ann works in the violence recovery program which offers free services at multiple locations on the cape and across MA.

Recommended resources shared by panel: Becoming Nicole, National Geographic transgender article Jan. 2017, Growing Up Trans (PBS), Gender Revolution with Katie Couric, Transgender Basics (YouTube).

The floor was opened for agency announcements. Mike shared that the triCHNA large Behavioral Health Grant will be released very soon. Should have more details at our next meeting.

The next meeting is scheduled for **February 13th**. The topic will be ACOs.

Meeting adjourned at 10:15am.
