Mini Grant Presentation: Terra Cura/ Healthy Plymouth - Algonquin Heights Mobile Farmer's Market/Colchester Farm Teen Employment Project

- Collaboration with Algonquin Heights, Terra Cura, New England Village and Colchester Farm in Plympton Massachusetts.
- Two days a week, students from Algonquin were provided transportation to Colchester Farms.
- The farm provides adults with disabilities a chance to gain work experience and one of the goals of the program was to have students explore working on the farm alongside adults with disabilities.
- 22 Algonquin Heights residents were able to visit the organic farm and use their SNAP benefits to purchase organic products for a family fun day.
- The students ran games, crafts, provided snacks and helped with a scavenger hunt for the kids and their families.

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- Students all wanted to come back for more hours. Utilized pre and post surveys to help with future career exploration.
