Meeting called to order by Mike Jackman, SSCPP Chair. Everyone was welcomed and gave self-introductions.

Minutes for the November 8th SSCPP general meeting were approved unanimously by all in attendance. SSCPP financial reports were made available by SSCPP Treasurer, George Gorgizian.

Mike reviewed SSCPP's funding opportunities: Mini grants up to \$3,500, Health Compass grants up to \$7,500 and Health Literacy grants up to \$10,000. We are also finalizing RFP for our SSCPP behavioral

<u>Presentation: The Challenges of Caregiving – Compassion Fatigue</u>

Dr. Donna M. White RN, PhD, CS, CADAC dwhite@prnassociates.org

- Teaches community health at Shattuck Hospital.
- Reviewed inherent values in healthcare and the philosophical roots of our work.
- Compassion fatigue is "a debilitating weariness brought about by the repetitive empathetic response to pain and suffering".
- Moral distress can put us on overload and in high gear for burnout.
- The topic of compassion fatigue started with the Vietnam War- men had PTSD and clinicians had secondary PTSD.
- We are absorbing compassion stress (aka secondary stress).
- Reviewed Charles Figley's Model of Compassion, Stress, and Fatigue.
- Recommended idea of asking someone to listen to you unload without asking him or her for any advice or follow up action.
- Reviewed cognitive impact of secondary traumatic stress and how stress affects the human body. Suggested prioritizing self-care.
- Examples of self-care suggested include: watch your own attitude, recognize you are not super human, get enough rest, exercise, and eat slowly. Also reviewed mindfulness techniques.
