Meeting called to order by Mike Jackman, SSCPP Chair at 8:53 a.m. All were welcomed and gave self-introductions.

Minutes from our October meeting were approved by all in attendance.

SSCPP held a moment of silence for Kerry Haskell from BID Plymouth's ACCESS program. Kerry sadly passed away after a courageous battle with cancer. She was a long time CHNA member.

Hospital Community Benefits Needs Assessment

Facilitated by Madison Maclean and Alex McKinney, JSI

- Deb Schopperle, SSCPP Vice Chair, introduced Madison and gave an overview of the purpose of the needs assessment. The hospitals are required to perform a community needs assessment every three years. Are looking to hear about unmet community needs. JSI has met with the SSCPP steering committee and are meeting with many other community groups as well.
- Madison provided a brief overview of the work. JSI will develop a Community Health Implementation Plan (CHIP) as a result of the needs assessment and hospitals such as BID

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Plymouth will use the CHIP to address unmet needs. Assessing will take place through June 30, 2019.

- All were asked to identify and rank priorities in three categories: social determinants of health, clinical issues, and target population.
- The following were the top needs identified in each category by the SSCPP membership:
 - a) social determinants of health: 1 housing, 2 transportation, 3 stress
 - b) clinical issues: 1 mental health, 2 substance use, 3 cognitive issues (i.e. Alzheimer's, memory issues)
 - c) target population: 1 low income, 2 youth & adolescents, 3 older adults

Mike invited all to bring materials for the SSCPP resource table.

SSCPP will share an update on its Behavioral Health grant recipients at next meeting. The Tri-CHNA group (Brockton, Blue Hills and Plymouth CHNAs) will be offering a large grant 5 year grant also focused on behavioral health to launch in January. More information to come.

The floor was opened for agency announcements.

The next meeting is scheduled for **December 12th**.
