Meeting called to order by Mike Jackman, SSCPP Chair at 8:59 a.m. All were welcomed and gave self-introductions. Minutes from our May meeting were approved and accepted as is.

Mini Grant Outcomes Report: New Again

Gail Farrell, Founder & CEO presented.

- Gail shared a brief video that showcases New Again and its storefront. The video can be viewed on New Again’s Facebook page here: <https://www.facebook.com/newagaininc/videos/816254248772239/>
- New Again’s mission is to enhance the work experiences of adults with disabilities by providing a creative non-profit business that benefits them as well as the environment and the community.
- Individuals served work at the shop and sell their art products. There is an artist studio on site where many of the products sold are created.
- Through SSCPP grant, four individuals were taught how to use a cash register system. This is a transferrable skill as individuals find future paid employment.
- New Again is located on 32 South Park Ave and currently offers hours Wednesday - Sunday.
- Runs as a tuition program and folks earn money from the sale of their art.
- Utilize a lot of recycled materials. Will take donations any time store is open.

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- Offer classes open to the community. Check out New Again's Facebook page to learn more about classes. Offering a community drum circle class starting on 9/24.

Navigating SSCPP Grants

- Mike shared information on SSCPP's three grant offerings: mini grant, health literacy grant, and behavioral health grant. Part of our mission is to get resources out into the community. Funding comes from Determination of Need monies (DoN) from BID Plymouth and South Shore Hospital.
- Mini grants up to \$3,500 and Health Literacy grants up to \$10,000 are offered on a rolling basis. Both of these grants are reviewed four times a year:
 - Fall: Applications due October 15th (Funding notifications November)
 - Winter: Applications due January 15th (Funding notifications February)
 - Spring: Applications due April 15th (Funding notifications May)
 - Summer: Applications due July 15th (Funding notifications August)
- Behavioral Health Grant is once per year and due on October 15th (deadline extended from September). Up to two grants of \$25,000 each will be awarded. Grant may be renewed for up to three years.
- SSCPP steering committee wanted to share more about the grants and asked some recipients to share their experience and feedback.
- Mike shared that our grant application has been the same for a few years; if anyone has any feedback on format, please share.
- SSCPP wants to invest in grants that are sustainable.
- Terri and Kim from OCES shared about their hoarding mini grant. Did not find grant application to be too difficult to put together.
- Kathleen of NAMI also shared about health literacy grant process- found it simple to put together. This grant involves training and must be connected to SSCPP's Health Literacy Action plan which can be found on our website.
- Sean, Jen and Kelly shared about the Plymouth Public Schools Interface grant application experience. This grant is currently funded by SSCPP. SSCPP is looking into hosting a bidder's conference for the next round next spring/summer.
- Grant is collaborative and grant writer, Jen, put it together. Took about a week with breaks in between to complete.
- Feedback from Plymouth Schools collaboration: Grant asked for a number of different attachments and may be easier to roll into one PDF; having a grant writer and collaboration team is very important; grant character limits helped keep them to the point and figure out what they wanted to hit in grant application; defining the specific service and utilizing data helped; useful to have one central person to consolidate the data and responses; stay in character limit and focus on answering the questions
- All agree that grant applications are clear on what they are looking for and easy to understand
